GENERAL FAQ

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WHAT ARE LEARNING PODS?

Learning pods provide an alternative method for families as they contain a 6 student cohort with an Ontario Certified Teacher. The goal of a "Learning Pod" is to provide small-group learning that encourages innovative teaching models with personalized learning and holistic curriculum. Currently, we are offering this option to students in grades 1 and 2.



WHEN WILL THESE LEARNING PODS TAKE PLACE?

The program will be offered on the same days as publicly funded school boards are running their programs. The duration of the program is from 9am to 12pm. Similar to school boards, we will be closed on holidays. We will however, not be closed on school board PA days.

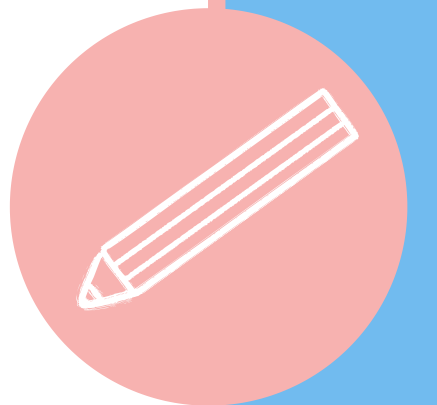
WHERE WILL THESE LEARNING PODS TAKE PLACE?

We are currently hosting our Learning Pods at 1650 Elgin Mills Road East: JEI Richmond Hill (Elgin Mills) Campus.



WHAT IS PROVIDED?

We provide the meeting space, program materials, face shields, sanitizer, and an Ontario Certified Teacher. We also supply each student with their own individual writing tools to reduce the sharing of items such as; pencils, pens, colouring pencils, markers, scissors. Students' temperatures will be taken at the start of each day.



WHAT WILL THE STUDENTS LEARN?

We are focusing on Literacy, Math, Science and Social Studies that cover the same concepts as the provincial curriculum tailored to each grade. Our in-person teacher will offer students learning opportunities and experiences that enforce and support curriculum content. Our mission is to provide the best support for your child's learning by delivering lessons and content that target and go beyond the Ontario Curriculum.



TEACHERS

Students are guaranteed teachers with the same qualifications as those working in the private school boards of Ontario. All of our teachers are Ontario Certified Teachers. We ensure that each teacher has an up-to-date police record check.

FEES

5 days per week: \$75/Day
4 days per week: \$85/Day
3 days per week: \$95/Day

Registration fee: \$75 per child
Program Fees are based on a 4-week program cycle per child

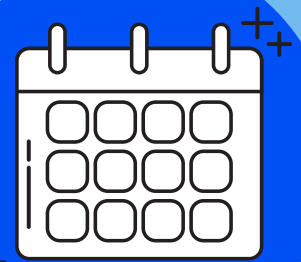

IS THERE A PROGRAM DIFFERENCE BETWEEN ATTENDING 3 DAYS OR 5 DAYS

Students will be learning the same program materials whether they attend all 5 days or part-time. Students who attend part-time will receive the program materials to work on at home and are still expected to submit the completed work. There are no make-up sessions for missed classes.



TUITION SCHEDULE & REFUND POLICY

- Determine how many program days you would like to sign up for
- First & last month tuition are collected upfront
- One-time registration fee \$75.00 per child
- Program fees cover 4-weeks program cycle
- Recurring payments are collected on the 1st of every month
- Last month tuition act as a deposit for the last active month at JEI
- Withdrawal notice must be submitted 30 days in advance in order to utilize the last month tuition
- Program spots are reserved on a first come, first served basis.
- Learning Pods require a minimum of 3 students to operate.
- Fees must be submitted upfront via e-transfer prior to the first session.
- Fees are non-refundable and may not be used as a credit towards future programs.



WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

- Learning Pods commence on September 8th, 2020
- Program fees include the following:
 - Material fees
 - Individual writing tools
 - Face shield
- Registered student must bring:
 - Snacks for recess
 - Face masks
 - Indoor Shoes
- Sample Daily Schedule:
 - 9:00am-9:15am: Morning physical activity
 - 9:15am-9:45am: Literacy
 - 9:45am-10:00am: Recess (student to pack their own snacks)
 - 10:00am-10:30am: Math
 - 10:30am-10:45am: Get-up and move activities (scavenger hunt, relay competition)
 - 10:45am-11:45am: Science/Social Studies/ Art (rotating subject throughout the week)
 - 11:45am-12:00pm: End of the day message and dismissal

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WHAT HAPPENS IF A STUDENT TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID?

Our students' health and safety is of utmost importance. In the event of a student testing positive for COVID, public health procedures will be followed. If any member tests positive for COVID, the Learning Pod will be closed for 14 days and sanitization of the meeting space will take place. While the meeting space is shut down, we will move to a virtual method to maintain student learning. All members of the pod will be required to be tested before returning to the in-person sessions.



HOW ARE THE STUDENTS SCREENED PRIOR TO CLASSES?

Since our goal is to keep our students and their families safe, we are asking that parents prescreen their child's health before attending the learning pod. This includes filling out an online form, taking the child's temperature and any symptoms of illness before each day. In the event that a child is ill, they will not be able to attend the learning pod until we have received a cleared COVID test.



THE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

This learning environment is intended for families who want small learning groups that follow public health guidelines including masking and social distancing. In order to keep our students and community safe, we ask that families who wish to participate in our program comply with keeping their family's social pod small. To reduce the risk of infection and spread, children will be taught hygiene procedures and will be active in maintaining a clean and sanitized work space.

HOW IS HAND HYGIENE HANDLED?

Before entering the Learning Pod, all members are expected to wash their hands and use hand sanitizer that will be provided at the entrance. Students will also be expected to wash their hands throughout the day as they transition through different tasks.
